Objectives for 2019/2020

- Maintain/improve current standards
- Align with proven methods of evaluation used by academia
 - Increase focus on outcomes (workforce)
- Reduce administrative work associated with application
 - Reduced costs for program growth

What is *not* Changing



- All current designations unchanged
- Peer mentoring/review
 - Candidates Program
 - Add CAE-CO
- CAE Program Office confers designation
- Focus on Program of Study
- Knowledge Units (KU's)

What *is* Changing



- Map course/program outcomes to KU outcomes
- Candidates Program required for all applicants
- Clarify re-designation requirements
- All re-designations extended
 - Multiple designation cycles per year
 - Program office will assign new submission dates
